THE House having been by several Proclamations prorogued until this day, then to meet for the dispatch of business, and being met—

A Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, requiring the attendance of the House in the Council Chamber.

The House attended, and being returned—

Mr. End moved for leave to bring in a Bill to provide for the establishment and maintaining of Public Booms in the County of Gloucester.

Mr. Speaker then reported, that His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor had been pleased to make a Speech to both Houses, of which Mr. Speaker said he had, to prevent mistakes, obtained a copy; which he read to the House, and is as followeth:

“*Mr. President, and Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council;*

“*Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly;*

“**Y**OU are again met for the discharge of the high and important duties, which have been intrusted to you; and I feel assured that you must all agree with me, that there are circumstances connected with the present condition of the Province, and immediately within your own control and superintendence, which demand, in no ordinary degree, the careful and mature consideration of a prudent and enlightened Legislature.
