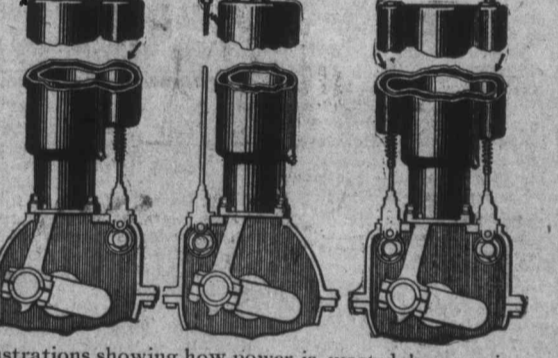

What McLaughlin Valve In Head Means



Illustrations showing how power is wasted by escaping into unnecessary water-jacketed area of the "L" and "T" motor.

"L" Head— In this type of motor there is 15 p. c. of unnecessary water jacketed space, due to the necessity of water-jacketing the valve pockets. This means a 15 p. c. loss of heat, which is the same as power.

Valve in Head— In this type of cylinder there is an absolute minimum of water jacketed area into which heat, which is the power that drives the piston, can escape. With this type, you get 100% efficiency from your fuel.

"T" Head— In this type of motor, with two valve pockets, there is 20% loss of heat, due to its escape into the water around the valve pockets. Heat is power, therefore this means 20 per cent loss of power.
