It will yield at least twenty-five bushels to the acre, and there are a number of fields of both Preston and Red Fyle varieties that will yield as heavily. The Red Fyfe grain is considerably later. A few fields will be ready to cut next week, but the bulk of the variety will require ten days to two weeks, and a few fields well to the north will not be ready before Sept. 5. I found absolutely no trace of frost in the district covered, even the tomatoes, cucucumbers and corn being untouched. There are light fields in this district on stubble, just as there are everywhere else, but the percentage is smaller even than in the Indian Head district. The lighter crops are to the south and towards Lumsden, where
