Speech of Minister of Marine and Fisheries on the Fishery Department's Estimates

Hon. W. F. Coaker Goes Thoroughly Into the Estimates Which Show A Reduction For His Department

But this year the collection of fees from Cod Fish Licenses Surgeon's Cove Head-Hoisting engine and outfit together with 10c. quintal on fish exported, will amount to \$150,000. The savings in cost of delivering supplies will amount to \$20,000 and if the rescue ship operates she will pay her expenses, consequently the votes of \$50,000 for Trade Commissioners and \$50,000 for operating the two steamers, and \$8,000 for Advisory Board expenses, will in al probability be wiped out and a balance of \$50,000 or more remain, t the credit of the Department.
