West Land Regulations

Any person who is the sole head of iamily, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The appli cant must appear in person at the Do-minion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any sgency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending

Duties - Must reside upon the home-i or pre-emption six months in the of six years from date of home-and entry (including the time required a home-stead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has oxhanste his bomestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchas-ed homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.-Must reside six mouths in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300:00. W. W. COBY.
