Notes on the Patriotic Tour.

Deer Lake and Humber River.

CHAPTER III.
I. C. M.

Amongst the more important centres of industry which the train passes, in the vicinity of which we have written, such places as Bishop's Falls, Grand Falls, Millertown Junction, the Topsalls and Grand Lake are prominent. These places are somewhat in the distance from the line but their commercial values to Newfoundland is very important, and in the course of years their benefits to the country will be even greater than at the present time.

The Exploits Valley had its prophet in the person of the late Rev. Dr. Harvey; and Grand Falls and the interior of this country generally, has its prophet in the person of the Rev. John Reay, now of Whitbourne, who nearly fifty years ago made such a forecast of the interior developments in Newfoundland, as seemed Utopian in the extreme; but which was literally fulfilled some few years ago, when, at Grand Falls, the great celebration was held in connection with the Harmsworth works of that place.

These gentlemen, which I have quoted possessed a wide vision, and we only wish that we had more men at the present day who possess some of the same optimism, and who would open their eyes and behold their heritage which God has given them, and which their fathers colonized in the days of Britain's early expansion. We have not vision enough of our country. Some of our views of Newfoundland are as narrow as the four walls of the House of Assembly, and as cramped as the smallest soul, of the smallest partisan of our different political parties, and it seems that our ideas of Newfoundland are limited by our party politics. There is surely a bigger public life before us than that which we have at the present time, but if we are to create this bigger view we must learn to lift our eyes beyond the horizon of local politics which have so long bound us, and when we have done this we shall begin to see in what a limited circle some of our public men have lived.

The entire territory of Exploits Valley, Grand Lake and Deer Lake presents scope for much careful thought and impartial discussion, but it is to Deer Lake we devote this chapter. Exploits and Grand Falls have had their prophets with visions as Tennyson says: "Dipt into the future"; but Deer Lake has its pioneer,

NO JOINT LOAN.


LONDON, To-Day.
In a statement explanatory of the arrangement at a recent conference between the Finance Ministers of France, Russia and himself at Paris, Lloyd George told the Commons this afternoon that the expenditures of the Allies in the war would be two billion pounds sterling (\$10,000,000,000) during the current year, of which Britain was expending more money than were her two Allies. The present war, Lloyd George said, was the most expensive in material, men and money that had ever been waged. Britain, the Chancellor told the Commons, could finance the war for five years out of the proceeds of her increased taxation, and France was able to do so for about two or three years with something to spare. Russia, he said, although rich in natural resources was in a different position. Lloyd George said it was decided at the conference of Finance Ministers at Paris not to issue a joint loan. The Chancellor said Russia had increased her productivity from 30 to 40 per cent. by suppressing the sale of vodka. Russia had had special difficulties in financing her purchases abroad, and the same thing applied to France. Each Ally must bring its resources into the common stock. Lloyd George continued: "War cannot be made under a limited liability principle. The conference dismissed the idea of a joint international loan which would have frightened every bourse. It has been decided each country should raise the money it needed within its own territories so far as conditions allowed, but if help were needed for purchases abroad, those who had the means could help the best in their power. The only joint loan would be with respect to advances made or to be made to smaller allied States. With regard to Russian purchases, the Chancellor said, it had been decided that at first £50,000,000 for this purpose should be raised in equal amounts on the Paris and London markets."

and one who in a practical sense outstripped the visions of prophets, and carved for himself a homestead, and by his energy gave the country practical proofs of what perseverance and industry can do, and also of what the soil of Newfoundland can produce. This pioneer was a hero in the truest sense of the word, and his name as many of our readers know is NICHOLLS.

Deer Lake is some fifteen miles long and averages about two miles wide, and its south-east shore is entirely skirted by the railway. The scene in passing is the best tell-tale of the verdure and agricultural possibilities of the locality, and some of the "forest still, stands, primeval." Mr. Nicholls has not had many neighbors, but there will come a time in the history of Deer Lake, when his name shall be spoken of as the pioneer of the district, and the fore-runner of a thousand homesteads. Not only are the boundaries of the Lake beautiful to behold, and the surrounding scenery romantic, but the lake itself is a very majestic sheet of water, and beautifully adapted to the purpose of transport, yacht sailing and motor boats. As a centre of summer resort, with the benefits of the country combined with the advantages which such a lake offers, no better site could be selected; and the fact of this lake being in daily communication with trains and telegraphs, it does not require much foresight to say, that within a decade or two, many country seats will dot its shores, and graceful yachts will sail its water, and plunging motor boats ply between its headlands.

The western end of Deer Lake is about twelve miles from the Humber Arm, and each body of water is about equal; the difference being that Deer Lake is inland and therefore fresh water, while the Humber forms the indraft of Bay of Islands proper. Why such beautiful places have been so long unknown, and so little heeded, seems difficult to understand; and yet after all it is not so difficult, because it would seem that in reviewing our history and colonization we colonized the Peninsula of Avalon only and failed to perceive the greater possibilities of the other parts of the country; for certain it is, that some of its beauty spots have long lain within the mists and silence of centuries untold.

LONDON, To-day.

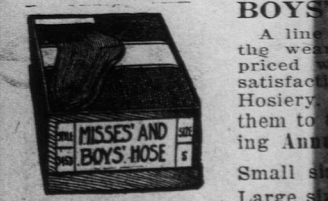
