YOUNG-ADAMS CO. GIVE BRILLIANT PERFORMANCE.

The Young-Adams Players scored a brilliant success last night by their excellent presentation of "Mary's Ankles." It all comes about in a three-act farce in which the humor was of the sort that is usually described as "rotous." The fun was fast and furious and kept the audience in almost constant laughter. Marjorie Adams displayed her histrionic talent to excellent advantage as Mary Jane Smith, her beautiful costumes caused much comment from the fair sex. Miss Adams' sister figure and charm greatly enhances the role which she played. H. Wilton Young as Doctor Whimpton delighted one and all. This character is somewhat different from that usually impersonated by Mr. Young, but it shows that this popular favorite is capable of taking numerous roles.

Young Dr. Hampton and his two chums find themselves sorely pressed for money. The physician has a wealthy uncle, who hard-heartedly by mail refuses an appeal for a loan. Then, Miss Fenwick appears in the guise of a Tag Day girl for the Belgian Relief Fund and relieves the trio of almost their last penny. One of the three conceives a brilliant idea, which they carry out much to the amusement of the audience. It all looks very complicated, but eventually everything turns out to the satisfaction of all concerned. Marguerite Young as a Argentine, the wise one, played a remarkably fine role, whilst her winsomeness was ever present. In fact everyone in the cast had parts that

seemed to have been made for them. The vaudeville and music was well up to the usual standard, and we can safely say that all went away well satisfied with the whole entertainment. 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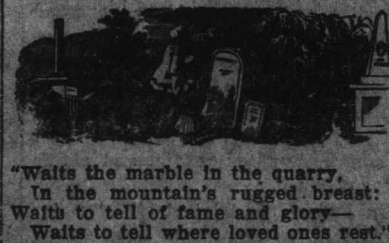
