MR. CARIWRIGHT'S SPECH.

We should soon, therefore, be little better off so far as the national debt was concerned than the mother country. At the best, so sudden an increase of diebt was a very risky policy. He next referred to the fitful periodical expansions of trade, and showed how, while in the five years ending 1854 the imports had increased three hundred and thirty per cent., from 1856 to 1864 they were about stationary, or had in fact slightly decreased. Again, they had been nearly stationary from 1867 to 1870, but had ingreased in the next two years from ninety-four millions. This proved the trath of the recuperative power of the country, but it also showed that the sudden expansions of trade were a very unreliable rasis to 'rest a permsnently increased expenditure upon.
