The Guild is an association of young women for the promotion of the spiritual and temporal welfare of the young women of the city, especially those who live in boarding houses and lodgings, being on the same principle as the Y.M.C.A. It has been in operation for five years. In May, 1923, a meeting was held in the interests of the Guild, in Union Mission Hall, College-street.

One great factor in the success of the Guild has been the fact that no class differences are recognized, the members are of all classes, including domestic. The young women are encouraged to attend and transact all business in connection with the Guild.
