The right honorable gentleman has replied to their demands in a letter as bewildering in its indefiniteness and circumlocution as anything which ever proceeded from his puzzling pen. But Taffy has no sense of humor. He is always desperately in earnest. He threatens to form a cave in order to harass the Government unless his demands be explicitly complied with.






