THE MEANING OF THE WORD CLUB. An interesting Appeal Case Now Before the Court of Common Pleas. On the 28th day of April last John Sebastian Charles, secretary of the Dufferin Club, was convicted by Police Magistrate Denison of being a member of the club. The March law unlawfully kept liquor for the purpose of sale, and that he had sold liquor without the license required by law. Yesterday Lawyer A. G. McLean, who acted for the defendant, moved for a writ of habeas corpus before the Common Pleas Division. The Dufferin Club is incorporated under the Ontario Joint Stock Companies Act, and the charter gives them power to conduct a club. Mr. McLean argued that the right to conduct a club implied the right to supply liquors and refreshments to the members, and that the supply of liquors to the members of a club was a necessary part of the objects of a club, and that there could not be a club without a bar. He also argued that the law which prohibited the sale of liquor in a public place was not intended to apply to a club, and that the charter of the club was a contract which could not be broken by the law. The court, however, held that the law applied to the club, and that the defendant was guilty of the offence.
