London, Oct. 18 .- The Shanghai correspondent of the Central News save that the Chinese Government is making great efforts to raise a domestic loan, offering seven per cent. interest. Several milions have been taken already.

The old forts have been strengthened, new ones are going up, and all the weaker points are being covered with earthwork. Troops are concentrating there rapidly, but many of them are indifferently equipped. The garrison is thoroughly alarmed for the safety of the port, and sensational rumors as to an approaching attack are set afloat almost daily. The commander has good reason to expect a sudden attack from the Japanese soon. A rebellion has broken out in the diss trict round Foo Chow, and peaceable persons are coming into the city by hand dreds. The fear of a Japanese attack has increased recently, and more torpe-does and mines have been laid in the bed of the Min. London, Oct. 19.-The Times corress papers now received afford negative evi-dence that the report three weeks ago of the despatch of an army corps to Hiro-shima was intended to be a bluff, such a movement being impossible in conse-quence of the shattered condition of the Japanese fleet. Moreover, Japan per-haps is beginning to reflect on the pro-blem of the eventual extrication of hest troops from Corea, where they remain on the sufferance of the maritime powers, especially Russia.
