THE DOMINION CATTLE, SHEEP, AND SWINE BREEDERS' ASSOCIATIONS.

Annual Membership Fees:—Cattle Breeders', \$1; Sheep Breeders', \$1; Swine Breeders', \$2.

BENEFITS OF MEMBERSHIP.

Each member receives a free copy of each publication issued by the Association to which he belongs, during the year in which he is a member. In the case of the Swine Breeders' Association this includes a copy of the Swine Record.

A member of the Swine Breeders' Association is allowed to register pigs at 50c. per head; non-members are charged \$1.00 per head.

A member of the Sheep Breeders' Association is allowed to register sheep at 50c. per head, while non-members are charged \$1.00.

The name and address of each member, and the stock he has for sale, are published once a month. Over 20,000 copies of this directory are mailed monthly. Copies are sent to each Agricultural College and each Experiment Station in Canada and the United States, also to prominent breeders and probable buyers resident in Canada, the United States and elsewhere.

A member of an Association will only be allowed to advertise stock corresponding to the Association to which he belongs; that is, to advertise cattle he must be a member of the Dominion Cattle Breeders' Association, to advertise sheep he must be a member of the Dominion Sheep Breeders' Association, and to advertise swine he must be a member of the Dominion Swine Breeders' Association.

The list of Cattle Breeders will be published in the first issue of each month, of Sheep Breeders in the second issue, and of Swine Breeders in the third issue. Members having stock for sale, in order that it may be included in the BULLETIN, are required to notify the undersigned, by letter, at least seven days before the date of issue, of the number, breed, age and sex of the animals. Should a member fail to do this, only his name and address will appear in the next monthly issue. The data will be published in the most condensed form.

Farmers' Institute Department.

At Frankford, Mr. LeTellier, a Jerseyman, read an instructive paper on sheep rearing and feeding. He said it was important to have some sheep to graze on their hilly lands. In spite of a downpour of rain, and all the enticements of a Saturday market in Belleville, some thirty good farmers were at the Wallbridge meeting in the afternoon, and 125 men and women at night. No doubt the reputation of Mr. MacMillan had gone from Frankford to Wallbridge and drew the crowd. His rugged oratory, practical common sense, his wide experience as a farmer, coupled with his legislative experience, make him a strong and effective speaker, who carries weight and influence with his brother farmers and gives them a stimulus to do better, such as few men are able to do.

Feeders' and Breeders' Convention.

A convention of the feeders and breeders of cattle, horses, sheep and pigs of the continent has been called to meet at St. Paul, Minn., on January 11th to 13th, 1898. Many prominent feeders and breeders will be in attendance. The programme is a most important one, and helpful results are looked for as the outcome of the convention. Mr. David R.
