General exports (G) comprise all three categories and in the general trade system, the sum of (b) and (c) may be tabulated as re-exports. Special exports (S) comprise categories (a) and (c). Semi-special exports (Si) are defined to equal national exports, i.e. category (a). Direct transit trade, consisting of goods entering or leaving for transport purposes only, is excluded from both imports and export statistics.
