

## Mandate and Organization

The Canadian Institute for International Peace and Security was established by Parliament with the agreement of all parties in August 1994. The Institute's governing legislation states that:

"The purpose of the Institute is to increase knowledge and understanding of the issues relating to international peace and security from a Canadian perspective, with particular emphasis on arms control, disarmament, defence and conflict resolution, and to:

• foster, fund and conduct research on matters relating to international peace and security;

• provide scholarship to students relating to international peace and security;

• study and prepare ideas and policies for the enhancement of international peace and security; and

• collect and disseminate information on, and encourage public discussion of, issues of international peace and security."

The Institute is a Crown Corporation, but one with certain special provisions which help to ensure its rigorous independence. Members of its governing Board of Directors are appointed by the Government of Canada on the basis of nominations from a wide range of organizations across the country and its mandate is an all-encompassing part of the House of Commons. There are several chapters in this report of which you are

Canadian citizens. Levels of funding by Parliament are specified in the funding legislation. The Institute submits an Annual Report to the Parliament and the Canadian public through the Secretary of State for External Affairs.

The Institute's Chief Executive Officer is a member of the Board, and has the responsibility for the overall direction of the Institute. A staff of about forty work in the following divisions: research, public programmes, information services, awards and contributions, administration and the Peace and Security Competitions Fund.

The Institute also has a self-advocacy policy position. It does this through public outlets, forums, and other means for the media and informed groups of citizens. While not part of the Institute's mandate, making presentations to the media, under the provisions of the act, provides research or advisory activities for the Secretary of State for External Affairs and relevant Senate and House of Commons committees, if it is requested to do so.
