



CANADIAN INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (CIDA)

The Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) provides most of Canada's international development assistance to some 100 countries. CIDA's Industrial Co-operation Program helps Canadian firms seeking opportunities for investment, joint ventures and transfers of proven technology in Asia, Latin America, the Caribbean, Africa and the Middle East.

CIDA's Industrial Co-operation Program (INC) offers financial incentives to Canadian firms to develop long-term arrangements for business co-operation and to carry out project definition studies in developing countries. Support is also available for building contacts and identifying opportunities through visiting missions and seminars. To be eligible for CIDA-INC funding assistance, proposals must clearly demonstrate mutual, social, economic and industrial benefits to both the host country and Canada. The host country benefits from new technology, job opportunities, business expansion and savings in foreign exchange while Canada benefits by selling equipment, components and services.
