### MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

Mr. Speaker: I have the honour to inform the House that a message has been received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate does not insist upon its amendment made to Bill C-176, an Act to amend the Criminal Code, the Crown Liability Act and the Official Secrets Act, to which the House of Commons has disagreed.

Mr. Speaker: I have the honour to inform the House that a message has been received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate has passed the following bills without amendment: Bill C-236, an Act to provide a means

to conserve the supplies of petroleum products within Canada during periods of national emergency caused by shortages or market disturbances affecting the national security and welfare and the economic stability of Canada, and to amend the National Energy Board Act. Bill C-245, an Act to impose an oil export tax under the Excise Tax Act and to allocate certain of the revenues derived from the oil export tax.
