issue. We intend to find an equitable solution. The point I am making is that issues such as this one will not be put on the back burner. There will be a reopening of the Act. It may very well be that the Justice Committee will convene to deal with this issue and other issues as well.

Although I reject a legislative commitment to a review, I certainly know as a practical matter that the Act will be monitored by Justice officials, and indeed I think we will find future legislation to deal with some matters that are not included in this particular legislation. I sympathize with the sentiments that have been expressed but I do think we have made a very good start.
