SALARIES AND CONTINGENCIES OF THE SENATE—Motion—

“1. <i>Resolved</i> —That leave be given to the Clerk to furnish details of the sum of \$44,098.74, paid for salaries and contingencies of the Senate for the year ending 30th June, 1879, for the use of the Select Standing Committee of the House of Commons on Public Accounts.	
“2. <i>Resolved</i> —That leave be given to the Clerk to furnish, for the use of the Select Standing Committee of the House of Commons on Public Accounts, a detailed statement of the amount paid to each member of the Senate for indemnity and mileage, and also of the number of days each Senator attended the sittings of this House during the year 1879, as per item of \$83,772.48 in the Public Accounts for the year ending 30th June, 1879, page 88, part ii. The Senate, in giving this leave, assumes that the said Select Committee are about to require the presentation to them of like information regarding the attendance and indemnity of the members of the House of Commons.	
“3. <i>Resolved</i> —That a message be sent to the House of Commons with the above resolutions, and to inform that House that, whilst fully recognizing their undoubted right to inquire into every branch of the public expenditure, the Senate, is nevertheless, of opinion that the critical examination of the details of such disbursements as those referred to in the foregoing resolutions is, in the interest of the harmonious relations of the two Houses, best left to the House by whose order payment is made.”—Sir Alex.
