Dear Sir:-

The enclosed letter was forwarded to me during an absence from the College from which I have returned only this morning.

Our Mr. Wright referred to me in June a former letter from Miss Monsanto enquiring as to the possibility of her being admitted here. Since previous enquiries from St. Lucia to the faculty of Agriculture had been chiefly from coloured students I thought it advisable to ask Miss Monsanto for information on this point. The enclosed is her reply. Her brother was making enquiry at the same time to enter for a course in Agriculture, in which there have been and are at present one or more coloured students.

While, I presume, there is logically no reason why a woman student should be refused admission on account of colour when there is no such barrier in the case of men, still in our circumstances I regret that we even have coloured men. I am not sure what the attitude of the University would be in this case and should be grateful for your advice in this matter.
