RAILWAYS APPEAL
FOR RATE INCREASE

Eastern U.S. Roads Want Application for Five Per Cent. Advance Reconsidered.

Canadian Press Despatch.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 15.—The eastern railways formally petitioned the Interstate Commerce Commission today for a rehearing in the eastern advance rate case and to permit them to put into effect the five per cent. increase which the commission recently denied.

The roads contended they faced an "extreme serious" emergency resulting from diminishing revenues and aggravated by war in Europe. Adequate additional income, the petition declared, could not be derived from the increase permitted in central association territory.

When the petition will be considered by the commission has not been determined upon.
