M'GILL BATTALION **COMES TO TORONTO**

Six Hundred Set Out for Niagara-on-the-Lake Training Camp.

SAIL ON THE CORONA

Overseas Company Will Join Thirty-Eighth Battalion at Ottawa.

As the Corona left the dock at the foot of Yonge street yesterday noon a rousing "Rah, rah, rah, Old McGill!" was given by 600 khaki-clad men. This was the parting salute of the McGill Canadian Officers' Training Corps. It was given to those who had come to welcome them upon their arrival in Toronto, and to those who hal come to the dock to see them off for Camp Niagara.

The corps is in command of Lt.-Col. Robert Starke, whose staff includes Major A. A. Magee, Major McKergow and Adjutant-Capt. Kemp, Capt. Creagor Barklay is in command of the overseas company. There are five companies in the corps. A brass and bugle band accompanied them.

University Men.
Shortly after the corps returns from camp the overseas company will join the 38th Battalion, C.E.F., at Ottawa, under command of Capt. Barklay. All the members are Canadian university men.

The corps left Montreal Saturday at 11 p.m., C.P.R., and arrived at North Toronto Station 10.30 Sunday a.m. In order to give the men a glance of Toronto, they were marched to the Can-ada Steamship Lines wharf, along Park, University avenue, Queen street to Bay, down Bay to foot of Yonge. Greeted by Mayor Church.

Mayor Church greeted the corps on behalf of the city. Lieut. G. R. Geary represented the Q.O.R. This corps, in conjunction with the University of Toronto Canadian Officers' Training Conps, who leave today, are to attend a camp of instruction at Niagara-on-the-Lake during the nex

McGill University was the first to establish an officers' training corps in Canada. It had been in existence taree years before the war broke out, but consisted of only one company. In response to the request of the inili-tia authorities that the universities meet the great demand for officers, the establishment of the McGill contingent was increased to four double

At the close of last year over 1000 members were enrolled and in active training. This number has been greatly depleted by men who enlisted for active service in the second contingent. Most of these men received their N.C.O. stripes. The battalion has sup-plied 80 officers, 10 of whom obtained
