The time will no doubt come when there will be a home market for the whole catch, but that time is not yet; so that total prohibition is for the present out of the question. And the same may be said of government ownership, which has also been suggested as a solution of the problem of home supply and cheaper fish."

An Investigating Commission. Continuing, it is recommended that commission be created to enquire into the personnel of the fishermen, and the ownership of the gear, tugs, boats, tents, etc., used by them. 
