

SINGLE TAXERS PLEASED WITH ENGLISH BUDGET

Louis F. Post, Apostle of Doctrine, Gives Epigrammatic Address in Zion Church.

"When you get peach tree principles into an orchard, you are apt to have peaches. When you get the single tax principle going you will pretty soon have single tax."

So spoke Louis F. Post, editor of The Chicago Public, at a reception held in his honor in the parlors of Zion Congregational Church last night by the Single Tax Association.

The new English budget, he said, gave the single taxers more even than the expected. A halfpenny in the £ was to be imposed on existing land value and 20 per cent on the increment. There was to be an immediate imperial valuation.

Mr. Post was frequently epigrammatic. "The earth was made for the children of men, and not for the children of John Jacob Astor alone," was one of his flashes.

Mr. Hardie had stated that he was in harmony with single tax as regards the relation of man to the earth. "One of the mistakes of our Socialists," said Mr. Post, "is that they say we don't recognize the relations of man to man."

"Specialization is a necessity of civilization," he said, "and it has intertwined the human race. Single taxers insist that there must be no interference with that interchange of the wide world over."

Julian Sale, P. P. Farmer, A. C. Thompson, and Rev. Percy Billings also spoke briefly. The advice of the latter was, "Give up doctrinaire discussion and buck in."

Rev. C. S. Eby presided.

FOREIGN SAILORS PRAYED Instead of Trying to Save Ship in Storm.

FORT WILLIAM, Ont., May 3.—Capt. Logan of the Hutchinson, an American boat with coal, arrived today after a hard struggle across the lakes.

He left the Soo Thursday morning with a crew of five Italians and two Gallians. In the storm on the lake, the foreigners refused to work and occupied themselves with their beads.

Logan headed the boat into the storm, but a great wave coming aboard sank the deck nearly two inches, causing the hatches to spring out.
