CROPS ABOUT AVERAGE THROUGHOUT THE PROVINCE Fall Wheat Averaged 24 Bushels an Acre and Oats 33 Bushels.

A bulletin issued by the Ontario Department of Agriculture gives the area and yields of the principal field crops of Ontario for 1909. The areas have been compiled from individual returns of farmers and the yields by a special staff in each township in addition to the regular crop correspondents.

Fall Wheat—652,375 acres yielded 15,967,653 bushels, or 24.1 per acre, as compared with 16,430,476, and 24.2 in 1908. The annual average for 1909 is 20.8.

Spring Wheat—135,161 acres yielded 2,232,567 bushels, or 16.5 per acre, as compared with 2,197,716 and 16.5 in 1908. Annual average 16.5.

Barley—695,262 acres yielded 18,776,777 bushels, or 27.0 per acre, as compared with 20,885,529 and 28.5 in 1908. Annual average 27.7.

Oats—2,695,585 acres yielded 90,235,579 bushels, or 33.5 per acre, as compared with 96,026,419 and 34.5 in 1908. Annual average 35.6.

Rye—94,961 acres yielded 1,573,921 bushels, or 16.6 per acre, as compared with 1,433,616 and 16.5 in 1908. Annual average 16.4.

Buckwheat—176,630 acres yielded 4,280,790 bushels, or 24.2 per acre, as compared with 7,401,336 and 18.7 in 1908. Annual average 19.4.

Peas—351,909 acres yielded 7,613,856 bushels, or 21.6 per acre, as compared with 7,401,336 and 18.7 in 1908. Annual average 19.4.

Beans—4,929 acres yielded 59,344 bushels, or 11.9 per acre, as compared with 783,777 and 16.9 in 1908. Annual average 17.2.

Potatoes—169,035 acres yielded 24,645,283 bushels, or 145 per acre, as compared with 18,517,642 and 111 in 1908. Annual average 111.
