Good Friday was generally observed around town and there was an almost complete cessation of all work.

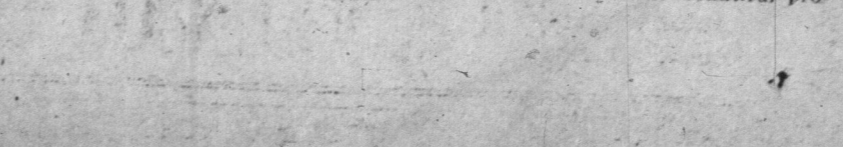
