COMMISSION TO MAKE WAR PURCHASES HAS BEEN APPOINTED

Ottawa, April 26—The independent commission of business men provided by Premier Borden to take over the purchasing of war munitions for the Canadian troops and to assist in the purchase for Great Britain in the dominion, has been appointed. The commission, as announced by your correspondent several days ago, will have for its head Hon. A. R. Kemp, minister without portfolio in the Borden cabinet, and M. P. for East Toronto. The other members of the commission are H. Laporte, of Montreal, and G. F. Galt, of Winnipeg, both prominent wholesale grocery and lumber dealers and well known business men.

While the announcement of the premier gave the impression that the commission would be chosen from men without the ranks of the government, and without regard for political affiliations, it has been stated for some time that the government could not very well acknowledge that it had no business men in its ranks fitted to take over the work.

It is true that the purchasing under the militia department and later under the sub-committee of the cabinet developed many features of weakness, and was responsible for the many serious disclosures brought out in the public accounts committee, still the feeling of the government was that the commission should to some extent at least be a government commission.

Mr. Kemp is a business man and both Mr. Laporte and Mr. Galt have had long experience in wholesale prices. The commission will, it is stated, purchase at wholesale prices and will eliminate the middlemen in the future.

Several other prominent business men were offered the position, but the fact that the duties connected with it are exceedingly onerous, and that they command the entire time of the commission, led to their refusal of the position.

The cabinet set but a short time this afternoon and their work, it is understood, was taken up almost entirely with the question of the purchasing commission.

DISCORD IN WOMEN'S PEACE CONGRESS

Manv Hungarian, Danish, Swedish and Norwegian Delegates Want the War to Cease, Whilst Others Are Against Interfering.

The Hague, April 26, via London, April 27—Discord appears to have sprung up among the delegates to the Women's Peace Congress. Nine American women reached The Hague today by way of Copenhagen, accompanied by Madame Rosika Schwimmer, president of the Hungarian Woman's Suffrage Association.

On the other hand, many of the delegates already here, under the leadership of Mrs. Fanny Andrews, of Boston, and comprising all the members of the resolutions committee and the Dutch women members of the congress, have taken the stand that such interference is not within the province of the present congress. Both sides have engaged in an active canvass for support.

Additional parties of German and Austrian delegates arrived today, but no news has been received here from the steamer Nordman, which has forty American delegates on board.
