Another notable act of barbarity was the repeated bombardment of the city of Rheims, France, as a result of which the famus cathedral was irreparably damaged and the library founded by Cardinal Gousset, and housed in the modern building constructed for it at the expense of the state was destroyed.

Formerly the kings of France were crowned in the thirteenth century cathedral. For a long period Rheims was the ecclesiastical capital of France. During more than two years it suffered from frequent bombardments, culminating in




