CATHOLIC DIRECTORY OUT
1919 Book Shows 17,549,324 Members of Church in United States.

(New York Times). There are 17,549,324 Catholics in continental United States, according to the 1919 edition of "The Official Catholic Directory" just published and copyrighted by P. J. Kennedy & Sons of Barclay street. This shows a net increase of 138,021 over the preceding year. Only nine dioceses showed decreases.

According to Joseph H. Meier, who has compiled the directory for the last fourteen years, if the "floating" Catholic population could be recorded, and if every diocese in the country had taken a new 1918 census, the total would exceed 19,500,000.

The directory announces that the increase in the number of Catholics in the last twenty-five years has amounted to 3,471,459. It also shows that altogether there are 25,822,650 Catholics under the protection of the United States flag, as there are 8,768,806 in Alaska, the Canal Zone, the Virgin Islands, Guam, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands, Porto Rico, and in the Philippines.

Other figures from the copyrighted summary, show there are in the United States proper: Archbishops, fourteen; bishops, ninety-seven; Catholic priests, 20,588; secular clergymen, 15,032; fathers
