Phillip Grannan.

Widespread regret will be felt in the city when it is learned that Phillip Grannan passed away last night at his home.

It is not given to every man to gather around him so many friends as Mr. Grannan did. He was born about fifty-six years ago, and during all his life he had lived in the North End, and it is in that section of the city, where he was best known, that he also was most beloved.

He started at the age of sixteen at the trade of shoemaker and after a little while he was in partnership with Frank McDonald for a short time, in the same block in which his present business is conducted.

It was not until about 1900 that Mr. Grannan took any interest in politics although he always kept in touch with affairs and took a proper interest in matters relating to the city and the nation.

For some years, beginning about 1908, he was a member of the Municipal Commission. In June 1913 in the general provincial elections he yielded to the pressing demands of his friends to stand in the Conservative interests, and he was elected to Frederickton. He held that office during the term until the general elections of last year.

Mr. Grannan was a man of strength of character, but yet one open to reason and always willing to see the other viewpoint of the other man. He was very unassuming and quiet, but yet always ready to take his share of the burden in public matters.

Mr. Grannan is survived by his wife, Mrs. Margaret Hogan, also of the North End, and three sons and two daughters. The sons are: Richmond, Phillip and James; the latter is residing at the Redemptorist College, North Street (Pa). The daughters are the Misses Marie and Frances, who is also in one another, Patrick, of the I. C. D.

The sympathy of the whole community will be extended to the sorrowing family in their great loss.

GIVING GENEROUSLY FOR NEW ST. DAVID'S

Reports submitted at a meeting of the finance committee of St. David's church on Saturday evening showed that the canvass for funds for the reconstruction of the church, which had been in progress during the week, had been highly successful. It is believed that, if the remainder of the canvass proves equally successful, it will be possible to proceed immediately with the plans for rebuilding.

The subscriptions now include one for \$2,000, another for \$1,000, several of \$500 and many of \$100, besides many of lesser amounts which indicate fully as much generosity on the part of the givers.

At the best, it is felt, the construction work undertaken at present will have to be planned with a view to future expansion. In this part of the building it is hoped that it will be possible to provide accommodation for the most essential needs of the congregation.

F. Neil Brodie is making rapid progress with the preliminary plans, which are to be submitted for approval, these including two distinct types—the colonial and the Gothic. The interior arrangement of the church is practically determined by the shape of the lot on which it is to be rebuilt, but it remains as to planning the Sunday school and institute building in the rear. The still being taken form indicates that it will be possible to make this a most modern and convenient structure.
