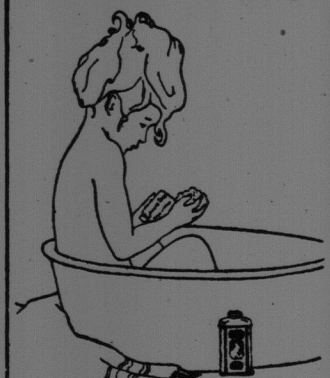

He is Mr. Quincey's right hand man and takes a great interest in the racing game. He reports that Mr. Quincey is angling for a trotter. Justina is a six-year-old pacer with a record of 2:19½, but capable of much faster time. R. H. Brett was purchased last winter and is a fine specimen of horse flesh. He has a record of 2:03½ mile track and 2:08½ half-mile track, and equalled this three times last year at Skowhegan, Gorham and Lewiston. It looks as though he would make all the free-for-allers step some.

Oro Fino, another junior free-for-aller, is in great shape and already for hard training. Mr. Gibson has taken great care of him this winter, faithfully jogging him nearly every day. His colts, now nearly a year old, are showing up finely. Herb Flemming showed his colt on the street Saturday and a better looking yearling would be hard to find.

Everybody seems to be optimistic this spring, and even Fred Cameron thinks Dan will be able to make a great showing this summer.

When Dr. McIntosh's string arrives and some more of the local horses get in training the Island will be a busy place. And won't we have some matinees this spring with all the material that is in sight and prospects of more to come.

CHARACTER MAN OF HARKINS CO. DIES IN JAMAICA

Bermuda papers to hand contain very lengthy criticisms of the W. S. Harkins Players who are now in their fourth and last week. One writer in a signed article declares them to be the best company that has ever visited the island and says that there is not a flaw in their work. He winds up his article by asking that at least a few of the company fall down in their acting so that he can for once get a chance to find fault.
The Harkins company now winding up their tour which has embraced Barbados, Trinidad, Demerara, Panama, Jamaica and Bermuda. Letters received by A. K. Mundie from Mr. Harkins says that business has been good, the only regrettable feature being that just before leaving Jamaica named Rowe was taken suddenly ill and died. Mr. Harkins was in Bermuda in advance of the company at the time.
The company is due to leave Bermuda on the 29th and will arrive in New York May 1st.
Mr. Harkins writes that so great is the demand on the shipping companies out of Bermuda that all passengers must agree to berth three in a stateroom.
