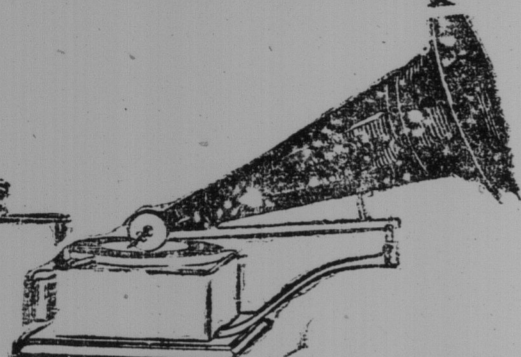

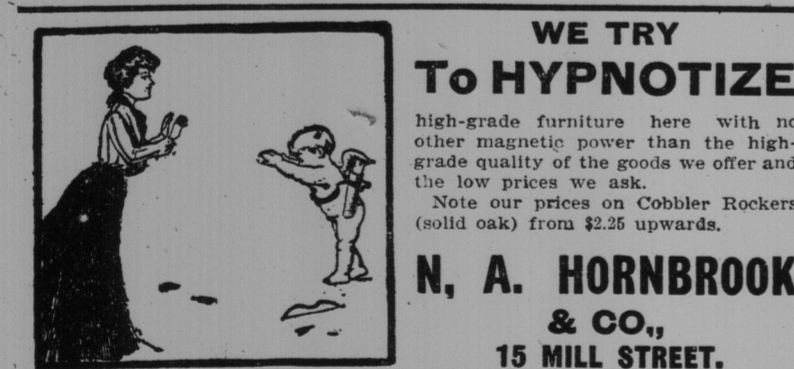

BALTIC FLEET MAY GO BACK.

Japs Don't Believe It Will Go East.

Russians Now Say They Saw Eight Jap Torpedo Boats—Japs Say There Were None

TOKIO, Oct. 29.—(Noon.)—The reported statement of an officer on board the Russian Baltic squadron, now at Vigo, Spain, to the effect that there were foreign torpedo boats among the Hull trawlers when they were fired upon recently by the Russian warships...

TOKIO, Oct. 29.—(Noon.)—A prominent officer of the naval staff said today that he believed the Russian Baltic fleet would not come far on their way east.

TOKIO, Oct. 29.—(Noon.)—The Russian squadron is still in port. Upon the main question relative to the identity of the Japanese torpedo boats said to have been seen among the Hull fishing fleet, during the night of October 21-22, Vice-Admiral Rojstevsky said to the Associated Press today: "Rumors had reached me that the Japanese would attack the squadron and when I suddenly saw that eight torpedo boats between our two divisions and heard the noise of firing of torpedoes I doubted not that they were Japanese."

LONDON, Oct. 29.—(Noon.)—Satisfaction at the fact that an arrangement has been reached and that an absolute certainty that the continuing inquiry will discredit Admiral Rojstevsky's statement as to the presence of torpedo boats among the Hull fishing fleet marks the comments of the London afternoon newspapers almost universally.

NO SHOW AT MAUGERVILLE.

CONSERVATIVE TIDE OF VICTORY SWEEPING CANADA

Reports From Everywhere Show Prospects Brilliant--Conservatives Will Carry Every Province Except Quebec and Will Make Great Gains There.

MONTREAL, Oct. 29.—For the first time since the opening of the campaign the Conservative leaders are divided in their opinions, and though serious trouble is not feared, yet the dispute at times grows interesting.

The Conservative will carry at least twenty seats in Quebec—a gain of only thirteen, while some expect a gain of twenty which will leave the Liberals only twenty-five majority. This will be more than neutralized by Ontario, where the Conservatives will increase the number of seats they now hold—fifty-four—and will probably have a majority of twenty-nine or thirty.

JAPS CAPTURE WAITAOSHAN.

Another Important Position Falls Before Their Advance

Russians Admit a Loss of 45,000 Men and 800 Officers in Recent Battle.

TOKIO, Oct. 29, 4.30 p. m.—Official reports confirm the press despatch of the capture of Waitaoshan by the Japanese on Oct. 27, adding that at ten o'clock of October 28 the enemy opened a vigorous fire against Waitaoshan, but retired in the afternoon.

HEADQUARTERS OF LEFT ARMY (General Oku), in the field, Oct. 8, 3 p. m., via Pusan, Oct. 29.—The positions of the armies are unchanged. The Russians are continuing searching the Japanese lines with their artillery firing night and day, with seldom any reply from the Japanese.

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 29.—General Sakharoff reports no general fighting on Oct. 28. There was occasional cannonading along the whole front, but the Japanese fire was inefficient and the Russian casualties were insignificant.

STRAY REVOLVER BULLET KILLS TWO WOMEN. One Was Shot in the Head—The Other Died of Heart Disease.
