

THIS LETTER HAS BEEN SENT

Ottawa 28th December, 1897.

Sir,

With further reference to your application on behalf of the Garford Manufacturing Co. of Ohio, for permission to take oil from the Moravian Reserve, I beg to inform you that the Indians by Resolution of the 8th ^{Division} ~~Instant~~ have agreed to allow the land of individual Locatees on the Reserve to be leased for oil or gas purposes, on terms satisfactory to the Locatee, upon which a Lease will be issued by the Department after a regular Surrender has been obtained from the Indians, as required by the provisions of the Indian Act.

The Department is willing, therefore, that the Company should prospect for oil on the Reserve, and if the same is found, to enter into an agreement for Lease with the individual Locatee, and upon the same being satisfactory to the Department, the necessary Surrender will be obtained, preliminary to the issue by the Department of a regular Lease.
