Pennsylvania has a pair of nifty ends in the Miller brothers, both of whom are stars of the brightest luster. Heine formerly captained the Quakers, while this is Ray's first year as a varsity player. Northwestern university also has a pair of ends who are brothers, and twins, the Marrows.

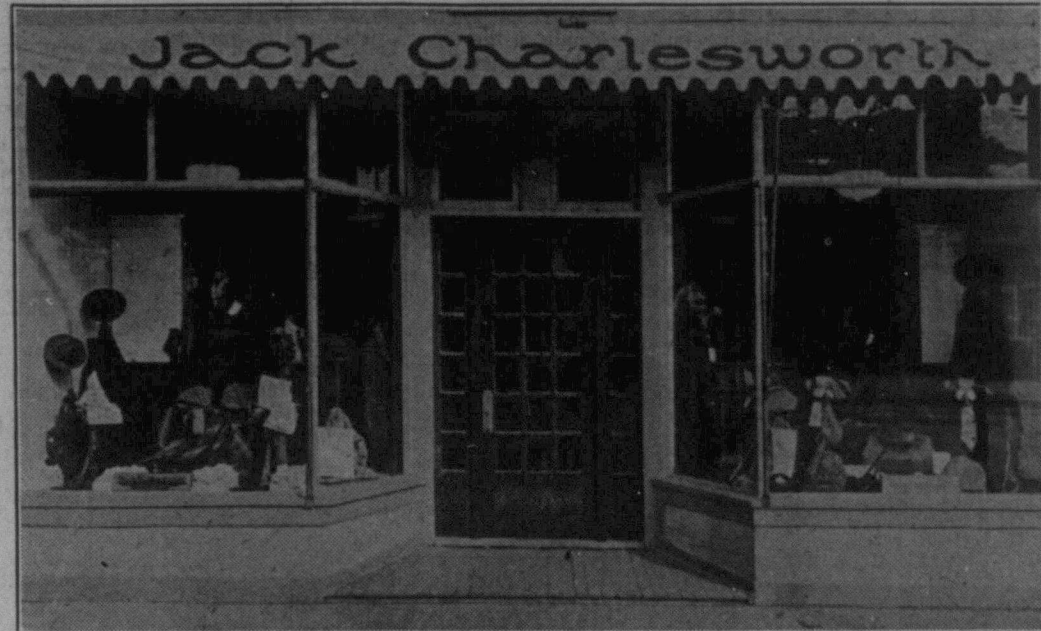

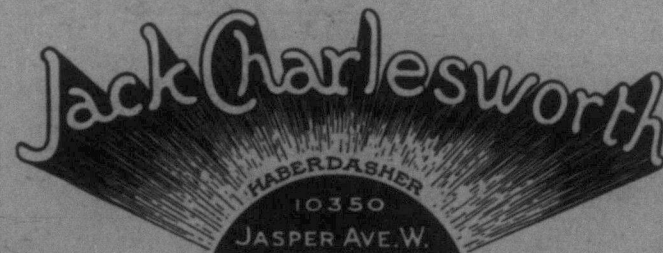
