ANSWER.

The Conference records with great satisfaction that our Home Mission cause manifests unmistakeable signs of advancement, and that it is regarded with increasing favor by our people generally. We rejoice in the largely augmented income of this Fund, from Circuits during the year, and in the measure of success with which our operations in this department of Christian toil have been already crowned. It regards the establishment of a Home Mission Society, and the prosperity which has thus far attended this movement, with encouragement; and hopes and believes that with the continued co-operation and support of our people, and the blessing of the Great Head of the Church, this youthful organization will be abundantly instrumental in evangelizing the destitute portions of our country. and in promoting the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom.

The following Regulations have been agreed upon for the management of the Home Mission organization:

1. This Society shall be called the Home Missionary Society of the Conference of Eastern British America.

2. Each person subscribing not less than one dollar, annually, shall be a member of the Society, and shall be entitled to receive a copy of the Minutes of Conference, containing a Report of the proceedings of the Society, with the names of the subscribers for the year.

3. Each subscriber to the amount of Twenty dollars shall be a life-member of the Society.

4. The sources of income of the Society shall be (1) The subscriptions and collections taken up at the Home Mission Meetings, which shall be held at all the principal
