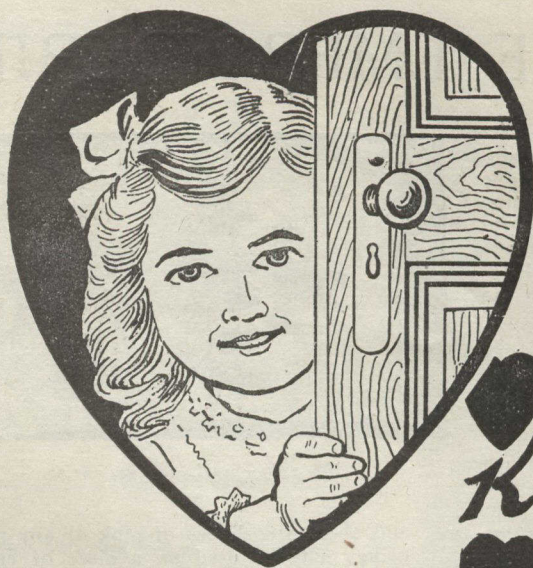

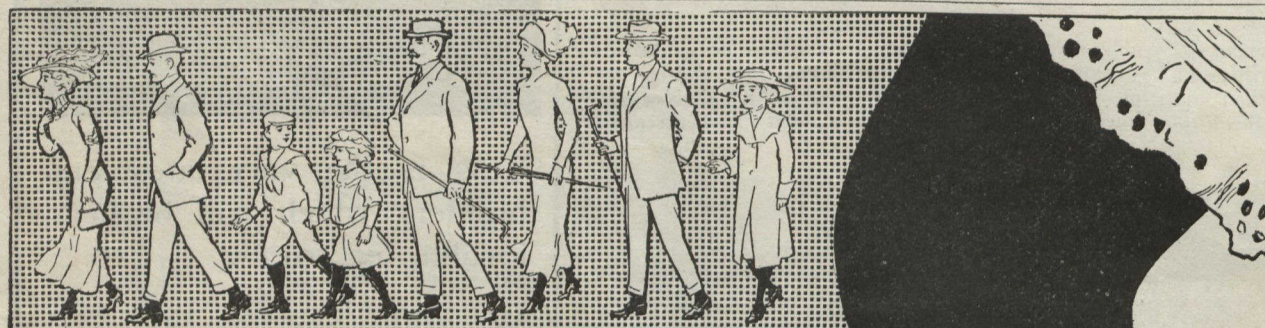
"Enclosed you will find the money for the first twenty-five. I am sure I can send in fifty before the end of the month.
