DENISON, Lieut-Col. FREDERICK CHARLES, C. M. G. (West Toronto.)

Second S. of the late Colonel George Taylor Denison of Rusholme, Toronto, and g-grands. of the late Capt. John Denison, formerly of Yorkshire, Eng. B. 22 Nov. 1846. Ed. at Upper Can. Coll. M., 22 April, 1874, Julia, second dau. of the late O. T. Macklem, of Chippewa, Ont. Called to the Bar of Ont., 1870. Was an Alderman of the City of Toronto from 1878 to 1884. Served as a Lieutenant in the Administrative Batt., V.M.; on service at Niagara in 1865, and on 20 Aug. of same year was gazetted Cornet in the Gov.-General's Body Guard, in which capacity he served during the Fenian Raid of 1866 on the Niagara Frontier.
