for the same Purpose; and also the Sum of Eighty-nine  
thousand six hundred fifty-eight Pounds, Sixteen Shil-  
lings and Nine-pence Farthing, now remaining in the  
Receipt of the Exchequer, being the Overplus of the Grants,  
for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred  
and seventy; and also the Sum of Four hundred thousand  
Pounds, which, by an Act made in the Ninth Year of His  
present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for carrying into  
Execution certain Proposals made by the East India Company,  
for the Payment of the annual Sum of Four hundred thousand  
Pounds, for a limited Time, in respect of the Territorial Acquisi-  
tions and Revenues lately obtained in the East Indies, is directed  
to be paid within the present Year into the Receipt of His  
Majesty's Exchequer by the said Company; and also such  
of the Monies as shall be paid into the Receipt of the Ex-  
chequer, after the Fourth Day of April, One thousand se-  
ven hundred and seventy-one, and on or before the fifth  
Day of April, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-  
two, of the Produce of the Duties charged by an Act of Par-  
liament made in the Fifth Year of His present Majesty's  
Reign, upon the Importation and Exportation of Gum Senega  
and Gum Arabic; shall and may be issued and applied at the  
said Receipt, for and towards making good the said Supply;  
and the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury now, or  
for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, or the  
High Treasurer for the Time being, are or is hereby au-  
thorised and impowered to issue and apply the same accord-  
ingly.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid,  
That a Sum not exceeding Twenty thousand Pounds out  
of such Monies as have been or shall be paid into the Re-  
ceipt of the Exchequer on or before the Fifth Day of April,  
One thousand seven hundred and seventy-two, of the Pro-  
duce of all or any of the Duties and Revenues which by  
any Act or Acts of Parliament, have been directed to be  
reserved for the Disposition of Parliament, towards def-  
raying the necessary Expences of defending, protecting,  
and securing the British Colonies and Plantations in  
America, be applied towards making good such Part of the  
Supply as hath been granted to His Majesty for main-  
taining His Majesty's Forces and Garrisons in the Plan-  
tations, and for Provisions for the Forces in North Amer-  
ica, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, and the Ceded Islands, for  
the Year One thousand seven hundred and seventy-one:
