Sir:

I beg to bring to the Department's attention the matter of the surrender of certain lands of the Sarcee Reserve to the City of Calgary, when it was agreed that of the money realized for the sale of this land, 50% could be used for equipment on the reserve.

The Indians have, of course, asked for many things to be allowed this spring in the way of horses, harness, implements, ic. I am not, however, prepared to recommend everything askedfor. I discussed this thoroughly with Dr. Murray, and outside of what is asked for in the Estimates, the following is all that the Indians actually require at the present time, to carry on their work:

4 - wagons, complete; 28" box; 6 - sets of work harness, complete;

1 - gang plow.

I would ask that the Department give this matter due consideration.
