

any country or group of countries. Nor was it a League to promote or combat particular theories of social philosophy or economic organization. It was to be a League to further ideals of peace and good-will among all nations, and between all classes. Only as member states continue to give their allegiance to this high conception of its function, can the League of Nations fulfil its mission to mankind.
