THE TRADE OF CANADIAN CONCESSIONS

A number of tables and summaries have been prepared dealing with Canadian concessions to United States, but after a careful consideration of these in conjunction with Messrs. McKinnon, Wilgress and Neal, it was decided not to include them here. The reason for this lies in the extreme complexity of the Canadian Tariff which makes it almost impossible to obtain summaries and tables similar to those contained herein, dealing with United States imports of Canadian products.

A few of these difficulties may be mentioned. For instance, some items on which Canada granted concessions are now items or sub-items of the Canadian Tariff and hence no figures are available. Moreover, the rates on a number of important items are dependent on such variable factors as whether or not a commodity is of a "class or kind made or produced in Canada". Again, values for duty purposes varied so greatly, especially under the previous
