for the lands referred to, whereas the combined rentals amount to \$1.68, leaving a balance of 67 cents, which kindly collect and forward to the Department.

3. OnePage 2 of your report, first item, the name of Alexander Gamelin appears as holder of Lots 14,15,16 and 17, Pierreville, but Lots 30 and 31 stand in the name of Pierre Picard, if these have been transferred to Gamelin kindly so advise. The sum of \$4.04 was forwarded as rental for the Lots above referred to, which sum has been credited on the four first mentioned Lots, being amount of combined rentals of same. If the Lots 30 and 31 stand in the name of Gamelin, be good enoug, when advising of transfer thereof to him, to forward also the rental therefor.

4. There is an entry as follows "P.St.Francois. P.26 Pierreville", with which the sum of \$2.88 was credited as rental: the Department has been unable to identify the lands referred to and I have to request you to be good enough to state the number of each Lot and where situated, together with amount of rental due. The name of Cote Gedeon was entered as holder of the lands referred to.

5. Honore Lyonnais has been credited with a payment of \$2.54 on 104, 12/26 of 103 and $\frac{1}{2}$ of 97 St.Francois: according to Books of the Department, the combined rental of these lands would be \$2.31- kindly explain payment and how same is to be apportioned.

6. On Page 3 of, Return, after apportioning the moneys

forwarded(\$3.58) on Lots 45,80,83 and 84 St.Francois, the sum of 10 cents only remained to be credited on $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 33 Pierreville. The sum of \$1.00 remains due on this Lot
