entertain any application to lease any portion of Squaw
entertain the Georgian Bay, as there is a dispute between
the Dominion and Ontario Governments as to the ownership

I may say that as the Messrs Noble Bros. have been in occupation of the Island for some years they have been allowed to remain on the Island and have been charged what the Department considers a fair rental for the portion occupied by them, the Department not being in a position to grant them a new lease.
