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Ottawa, September 13, 1919.

Rev. Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th instant, in which you ask to be supplied with note paper and envelopes.

In reply I beg to inform you that a supply will be sent you under separate cover.

With reference to your proposed visit of inspection to the Indian schools on or before the 15th of October, next, I beg to say that this is satisfactory to the Department. You should furnish a full report on each school visited by you. A supply of blank forms for this purpose will also be sent you. It is thought that by the time you visit the different schools the work will be well under way after the summer holidays and you will be able to judge of the work being done in the class-room and the progress that is being made. You will be good enough to fill in the reports under the various headings fully as possible. A separate report should be made out for each school visited by you, and, upon your return to your home, you will be good enough to forward them to the Department. Any recommendations which you care to make will receive consideration. You should be guided in your work of inspection by the letter of instructions which you received at the time of your appointment.
