(b) Personnel to man three Flotillas of L.C.I.(L) plus Squadron Staff and Beach Party have been drafted.

Officers and ratings have been drafted to the R.N. Algerines "Lightfoot" "Melita" "Persian" and "Postillion" to act as runner crews to steam these vessels to the U.K. On arrival these crews will be based at commission Corvettes building there for the Depot records made our position stronger.

(e) The Escort Carrier H.M.S. "NABOB" has been supplied with a crew excluding Flying & Maintenance Personnel. The following shows the R.C.N.V. is manning two Coastal Craft Flotillas.

(g) H.M.S. "ARETHUSA" was steamed to the U.K with one complete Canadian Fleet Destroyer crew, plus additional Engine Room ratings. The Fleet Destroyer crew will man a Canadian ship whereas the balance will remain on loan to the R.N. for training.
