I have the honour to transmit to you
herewith a copy of a memorandum which has been
drawn up by the authorities in London outlining
recent discussions on the subject of the recruitment
in Canada of trained firemen for fire-fighting in the

It will be observed from the fifth paragraph of this memorandum that the proposal was made by the High Commissioner for Canada in London that I should take this matter up on my arrival in Canada with the Canadian municipalities, having first secured the concurrence and assistance of the Federal authorities. I should be very grateful if I might receive your advice on how to proceed in this matter and if I might also be informed of the views of the Canadian Government on the proposals as they now stand.
