Dancoisne to his name on the tattoo report for that day I entered his name on the tattoo report for that day and continued to report him absent at reveille and tattoo for the remainder of my tour of duty until I handed my duties to Sergeant Milton, C, of No.3 Company at reveille, the 30th of March 1942.

The accused declines to cross-examine the witness.
