
I submit, herewith, in duplicate, a request from the Standard Logging Co. for a renewal of the above Licence for another year, as from May 1st, next -- which I would recommend.

Also attached, in duplicate, is a letter from the Licensee which has to do with Clause 4, in the Special Conditions listed on the Licence itself, which states:

"The wood fuel as mentioned before will be available to Indians and hauled to householders in the area as far as Nanaimo."

In this regard I might say that I realized that the Company, in their letter of May 19th, last, really meant that the Indians of the Chemainus and Nanaimo Bands could get all the wood fuel they required, but expected the Indians would have it delivered themselves. I know this because the Company never had a delivery service, nor have they now. It would appear as if the Indians should make their own arrangements for delivery as all they have to do is load it up in trucks and haul it away. It is even cut in 14" lengths.

Your reaction to this suggestion will be appreciated.
