the statement which I have previously made that I do not advise radium treatment in cases in which operation is possible. The point I wish to emphasize is that, judging from my own experience, every case of sarcoma which is treated surgically should afterwards receive the benefit of radium treatment, and that where surgery cannot be used radium offers a very good prospect of retarding the development of the malignant process, ameliorating the symptoms, and prolonging life in a condition of comparative comfort.

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
