

- 36.—HEAD of a child in terra cotta; an original work, by Mr. Van Luppen. Height, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
- 37.—EXHUMATION. Six small pieces of *Old Chinese* work, recovered at the sack, in 1860, of the Summer Palace, Pekin.
- 38.—DISH. Gold lustre of rich design; a re-production of old Italian ware, from the *fabrique* of the Marchese Ginori at Doccia. *Modena Florentine*. Diameter, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
- 39.—DISH. Decoration, a central mask encircled with arabesques; same ware as No. 32. Diameter, 9 inches.
- 40.—CUP with cover; in opal glass; the bowl arranged in facets, the stem being of elaborate design and difficult execution; a reproduction by the Murano Glass Company. *Modern Venetian*. Height, 10 inches.
- 41.—GLASS. A small collection of *Modern Venetian*. Same *fabrique* as above.
- 42.—SCONCE of hammered brass, by Messrs. Faraday & Son, London.
- 43.—CABINET. Ornamented with scenes in which mythological and scriptural incidents are curiously blended. The two lower stages and the top piece are modern. *Or Dutch (?)*.
- 44.—JAR. Glazed earthenware; yellow ground, with bold and well-drawn foliated ornament. *Modern Lucknow* (Seinde). Height, 9 inches.
- 45.—JAR. Glazed earthenware, green ground; the form and ornamentation shew the influence of metal-work. *Modern Indian* (Seinde). Height, 10 inches.
- 46.—JAR. Glazed earthenware, blue-and-white. *Modern Indian* (Punjab). Height, 12 inches. Also a Dish, 18 inches diameter.
- 47.—BEAKERS. Pair of Nankin, blue-and-white. *Old Chinese*. Height, 12 inches.
- 48.—RAPIER. Steel, with elaborately chiselled hilt and perforated guards, the decorations consisting of animals, masks and foliage. *Old Spanish*, probably 17th century. Length, 35 inches.
